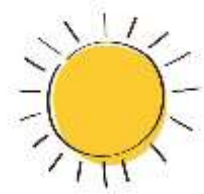

It feels as though summer may have arrived. Last evening (June 15th) in the Parish Church the sun streaming through the west window was wonderful. What a great day for those who enjoyed the big lunch in the Abbey grounds.

The Choral pilgrimage was super, a service of choral works punctuated by different readings, it was very special. Led by Andrew Kirk and sung by our own choir whilst moving to different parts of the building, the acoustic enabling us to appreciate the sound in a number of settings, thank you Andrew and thank you to our choir.

We have such a lot going on during these coming summer months.

The arrival of **Luke, Vicky, Phoebe and Thomas Falvey** at the beginning of July, with the opportunity to be with them at Luke's licensing on 7th July at 4 p.m. in the Parish Church, and then at their welcome services in Holy Trinity at 10 a.m. on 14th and Saint Lawrence at 10.30 a.m. on the 21st is very exciting. Please remember them in your prayers as Luke takes up his new role as Associate Priest in this parish. The licensing on the 7th July will be carried out by the Bishop of Tewkesbury.

Thomas Hawkes arrives in the parish as Organist and Choir master taking up his role on July 14th. Thomas comes at an exciting time as we move into August, a number of visiting choirs will be joining us,

Juniper a Choir from the States (not to be missed) are returning this year and will take up residence from the 4th – 11th August. Then on 21st August 6 p.m. the Cathedral Choir of Freiburg will be giving a concert in the Parish Church. Thomas provides musical accompaniment for this choir as they travel on their various tours. With all of this and Thomas's arrival we hope to see the musical traditions of our three churches expanded, it's all very exciting. Thomas's first service will be July 14th at the morning Eucharist. Come and say hello.

I encourage you earnestly to take note of these dates and if possible to make it a priority to come along and support these two gentlemen as they arrive in our parish.

The weekend of 5th – 7th **July** we have a sustainable flowers **Flower Festival** taking place in the church. More Musings from Mark



Mark 4:38 NIV

[38] Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, “Teacher, don't you care if we drown?”

How easily we allow the negative to affect us. It is noticeable how emotion trumps statistics. Walk to the shop for 20 years happily and freely, then a mugging and suddenly we don't walk that way anymore. Fear and doubt have set in.

The setting for this verse is the crossing of the Sea of Galilee with Jesus. Whilst in the boat a storm erupts, not an unusual event, but a storm of a magnitude that worries even the stalwart fishermen among them. They are in panic, Jesus is sound asleep on a cushion. The difference is striking, but the words are hurtful. *“don't you care...”*

Mark's gospel is a reflection of Peter's memories, and it's only in this gospel that we hear such hurtful words *“don't you care...”*. One thing about Peter is his honesty, and it suggests that these were the words of Peter himself, words of which he is now ashamed, but were uttered at the time.

When it goes wrong, how often we think that those who care for us have turned against us. Many think that often of God the father;

somehow he's turned against us, punishing us, training us through proactive pain. This is not the God we serve. His heart is always for us, but things happen in the world that are painful. God didn't send them but he does allow humanity to behave as it wants, and so in the midst of our fear and doubt, he is there with his love. Note Jesus didn't condemn the speaker for his words, he just dealt with the situation as it was. God is love, and painful situations don't change him. Jesus wept at the grave of Lazarus (John 11) even though he was going to resurrect him. He knows our situations, and he cares. So rather than doubt him, call him for his help as the psalmist does so often. He cares for you. Peter in later years reminds us,

1 Peter 5:7 Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

Please remember to pray for Pauline, Fiona & Angela as they take on the role of Branch Contact. Across the Diocese so far this year, there have been 12 enrolments. It's exciting to welcome these new members to Mothers' Union, a Worldwide Charity with over 4 million members in over 80 countries.

Two of Our Aims and Objectives are to maintain a worldwide fellowship of Christians united in prayer, worship and service and to promote conditions in society favourable to stable family life and the protection of children. *“I rather think on Judgement Day,
When all are on their knees,

To those of us who are becoming increasingly frail these are very reassuring words. We have recently lost two much-loved gentlemen from our parish who have contributed a great deal to this view of Gloucestershire.

I did not know Guy Wheatley well but had seen him at work in Cirencester Hospital. When Penny took the services there Guy would bring patients to them in wheelchairs. He was a kind, loving and gentle, just at a time when people needed it. He was much respected by all in his work there.

Bob Gardiner was someone who shared my Gloucestershire sporting life. He was more Kingsholm than Forest Green but we shared e-mails about our success, or lack of it, of our County Cricket Club. He remembered such eccentricities as the ‘Dudbridge Donkey’ and had this area firmly in his heart. Readers may remember his scholarly and spiritual articles in this magazine.

Guy and Bob did much for this area and for different reasons are loved and respected by all who knew them. Their families should be very proud.

An adopted son of our County (he came from Wiltshire) is George Field. Now 104 years old, George was a goal keeper at Arsenal, playing with all the pre-war greats. He was a contemporary of the Compton brothers.

When war came in 1939 Arsenal insisted all their players signed on. George joined the RAF beginning a stellar career. He married Dorothy, as Isle of Man girl, and when war ended George was 26 years old. He could have returned to football but there was a limiting maximum wage. He remained in the RAF flying to Christmas Island, and latterly became an engineer on Concord. This brought him to Cirencester and he now lives in Watermoor House.

There was a marvellous tea party there to commemorate D-Day and George cut a ribbon on the main gates which were festooned with poppies. He looked distinguished and very fit for someone of his age. He proudly wore his medals and all the house were proud of him. So should we be; also of the Revd John Swanton, Vicar of Ampney Crucis who organised splendid celebrations at Down Ampney airfield from which so many flew on that memorable day.

I saw the King on television and also his sister, the Princess Royal, both speaking well and reacting with the Veterans and their families. Come to think of it, don't they both come from Gloucestershire?

ARTIST RESIDENCY

ICONS AS A LIVING TRADITION



From Saturday 13 to Friday 26 July, the parish church will be hosting an artist in residence, priest and iconographer, Catherine Lomas. Catherine was, until 2023, a parish priest and pioneer in the Diocese of Peterborough. Now based locally and a member of the parish church, she is exploring a calling as full-time iconographer and sacred artist. Her particular interest is in the use of visual means to explore theology and spirituality, seeing our search for the Divine as sharing much in common with humanity's innate longing for beauty.

Her interest in icons began in 2007, she painted her first icon in 2016, and now exercises her priestly ministry through leading and speaking about icons, art and spirituality, as well as accepting commissions for new icons and sacred art (more details at www.catherinemaryicons.uk). You can come and see Catherine at work anytime during the period of residency between 9.30am and 5pm (excluding Sundays, and subject to other church events). The newly-acquired icon of St John the Baptist, which you will find on a south pillar in the nave, was painted by Catherine and you can see this together with a display of her other icons. Printed icon cards of her work are for sale in the church shop, with icons and larger prints available to order or buy direct from Catherine.

On Saturday 20 July, starting at 3pm, Catherine will be giving a talk entitled "Seeing God's world differently", followed by time for questions. So, if you want to know more about how icons are painted, why they sometimes look rather unrealistic, or how icons can help us in our prayer and worship, do come along and bring your questions. All are welcome.

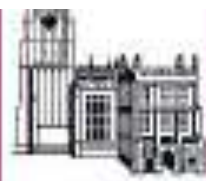
